

Style Manual Bibliography

Style manuals provide guidelines for how to format the elements of your citation. Many of these style manuals have been published by professional organizations (such as the Modern Language Association or the American Psychological Association) or by an individual whose authority is generally accepted within academic circles. In addition to providing guidelines for how to cite sources, these manuals give background information on other elements of style such as proper page layout, punctuation, quotations, etc.
